EXAMPLE #3:

CSU DOMINGUEZ HILLS WORKFORCE INTEGRATION NETWORK

The <u>California State University (CSU)</u> <u>Dominguez Hills Workforce Integration</u> <u>Network</u> (CSUDH-WIN) is on a mission to close the digital divide and improve digital inclusion of marginalized communities through four components, from providing Broadband access and equipment installation to community training and workforce readiness.

Effectively engaging and communicating with community-based organization members is mission critical for CSUDH-WIN.

To strengthen collaboration and leadership, CSUDH-WIN partnered with Participate to build the **Toro Impact community of practice** to bring together students, interns, faculty, communitybased organizations and their patrons. Within this digital community:

- **Students can** move through learning pathways on topics like project management, data analytics and marketing to digitally upskill for workforce readiness.
- **Student interns can** connect and collaborate with community organizations.
- Community organization members can access digital literacy workshops; collaborate to co-create guidelines to improve digital equity; and coordinate digital equipment device distribution events for their patrons.



To motivate engagement, celebrate accomplishments and certify learning, the Toro Impact community of practice relies on a structure of digital badges and verifiable credentials for each stakeholder group.

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
